Introduction

The NSS unit of KCT's Late G. N. Impact and Significance

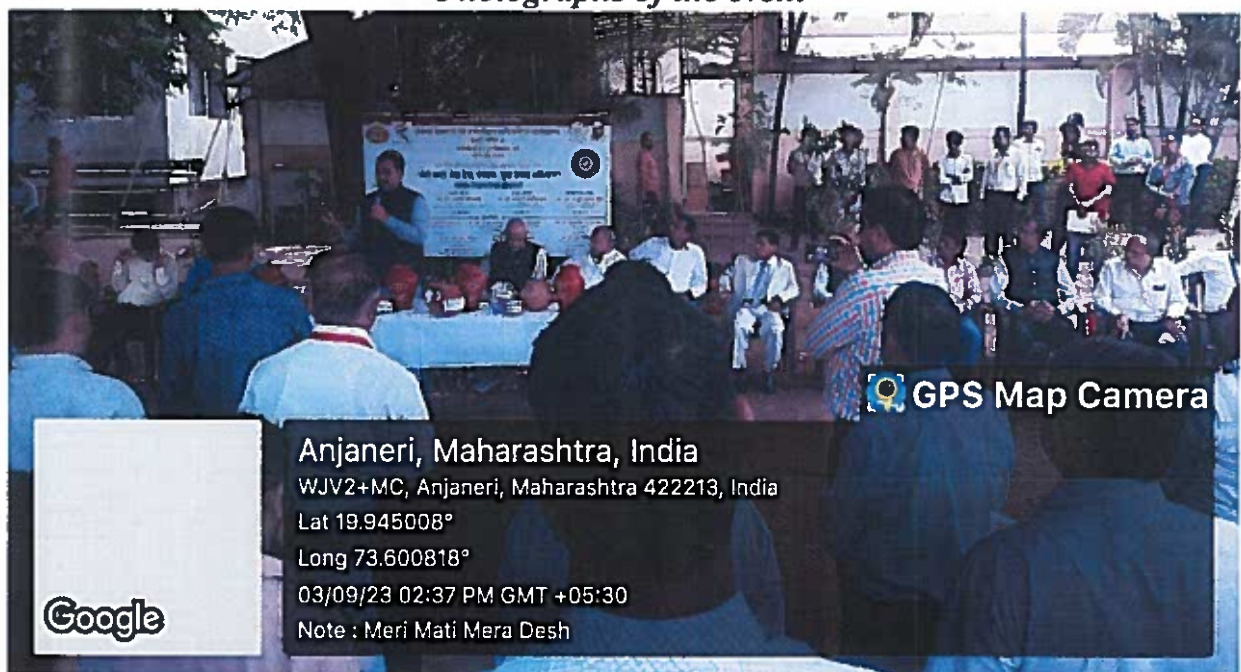
