Impact and Significance

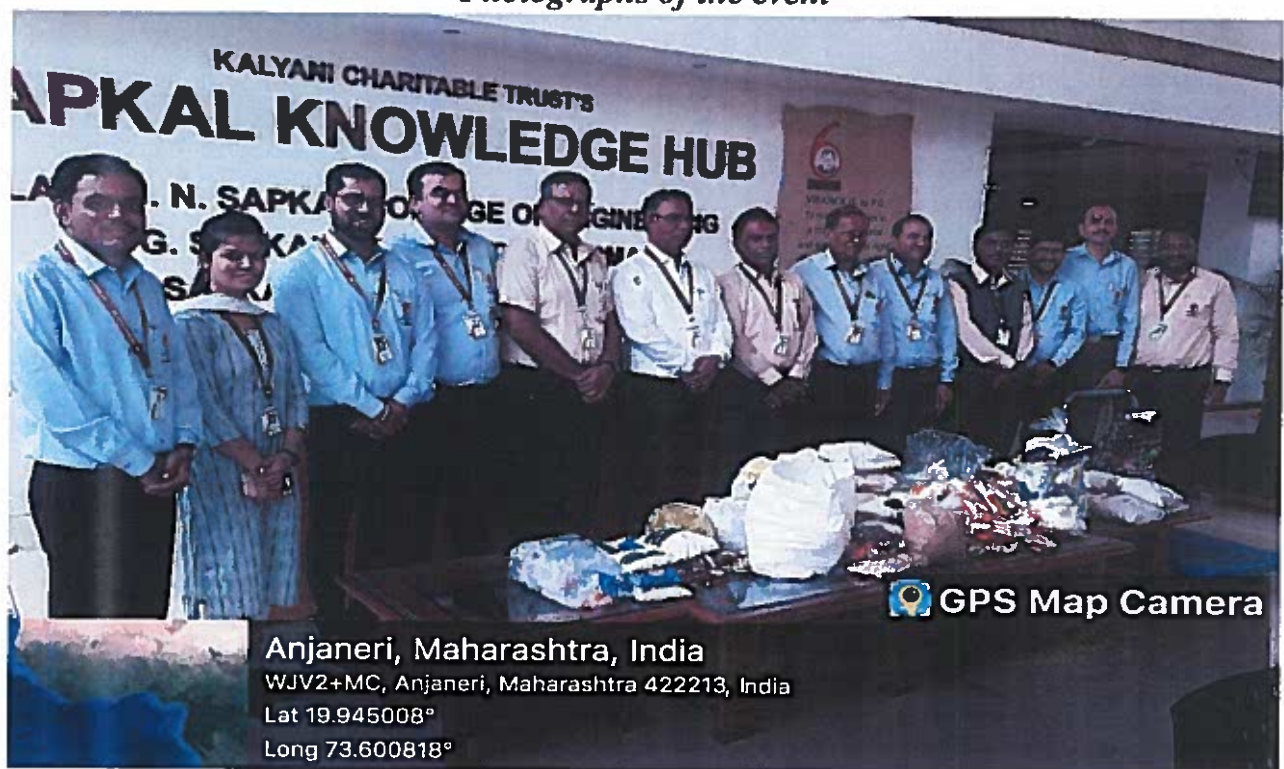
