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Awareness: The plays effectively conveyed the intended messages on voter awareness, Woman empowerment and Cyber Security. They raised awareness and prompted discussions within the community.


Engagement: The use of street plays as a medium engaged the audience actively and emotionally, making the messages more relatable and memorable.

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
