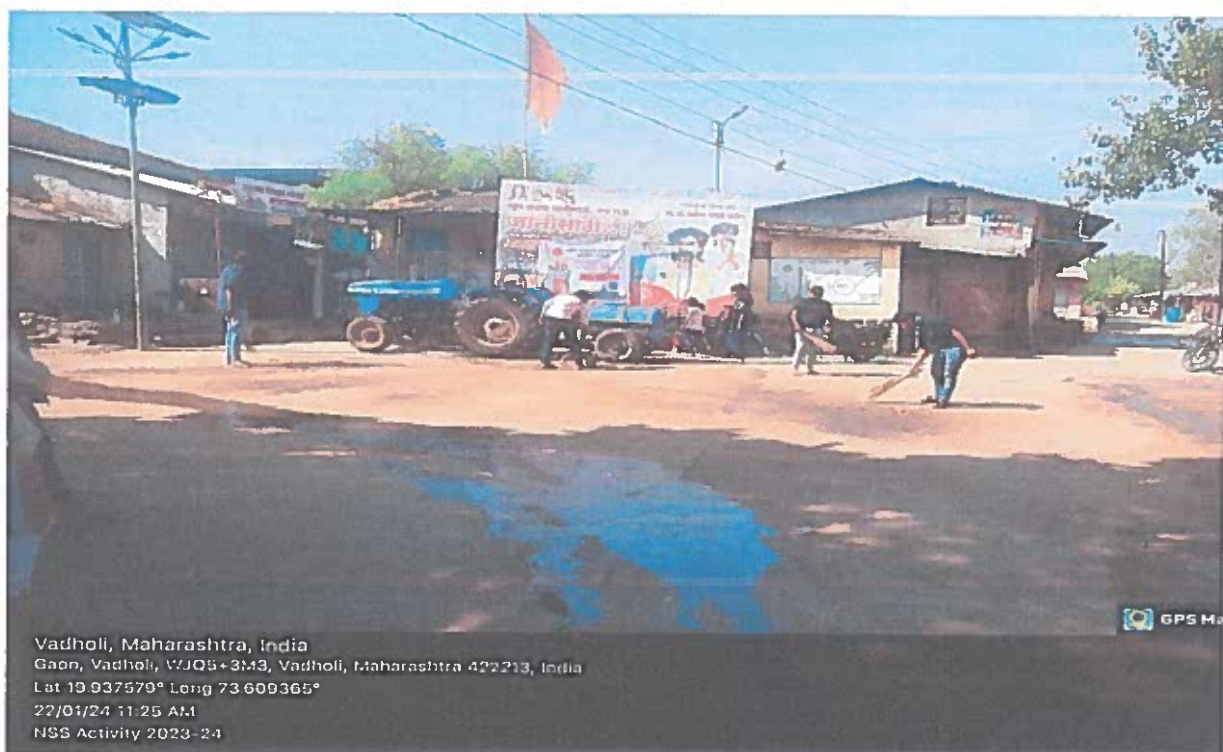
The activity helped instill a sense of pride and responsibility among the participants, fostering a culture of cleanliness that is essential for a healthier and more aesthetically pleasing environment.
